Applicant's Story

1. What happened?
2. Where did the exploitation happen?
3. When did the exploitation begin and when did it end (if ended)?
4. Were you forced to do something you didn't want to do? What was that?
5. Did someone threaten or pressure you or your family or loved ones?
6. What would have happened if you left the situation, or refused to act as suggested or ordered?

Applicant's Need for Assistance

In relation to experiences as a victim of human trafficking, what type of assistance is needed? Is some assistance already available? What else is required? Is the need for assistance urgent? If security threat is targeted at the Applicant, describe it here in detail.

Applicant's Underage Children Referred to NAS

A consent for referral must be attained from the guardian or (legal) representative of the child. Young people of 15-17 years of age must give their consent alongside their guardian / representative.

National Assistance System for Victims of Human Trafficking (NAS)

The NAS helps victims of human trafficking, their underage children who are in Finland, and people that need special assistance during the investigation of a crime related to human trafficking.

Assistance will be arranged based on an individual needs assessment and it may include:

- Guidance and counselling
- Social and health care services
- Interpreting and translating services
- Safe housing
- Social assistance or reception allowance
- Help with safe return if a victim wishes to return to their home country
- Temporary reflection period, if needed (1-6 months)

Being a client and getting services is voluntary.

A person admitted as a client in the NAS is formally identified as a victim of human trafficking.

Other authorities must take this into account if they are processing information that relate to the person's rights as a victim of human trafficking.

The client relationship will end when a need for assistance is ceased, or if the client disappears, moves away from Finland or is removed from the country.

A client can also request the termination of the client relationship.

This is how assistance is organized

- If a victim has a municipality of residence in Finland, their need for assistance will be assessed and services will be provided in the social and health care services of the wellbeing services county* in whose area the municipality of residence is located. Guidance and advice can also be acquired from the NAS. *In the case of a client in Helsinki, the City of Helsinki and the HUS Joint Authority.
- For asylum seekers, the NAS will help in cooperation with a reception centre.
- If a victim doesn't have a municipality of residence and is not a client of a reception centre, the NAS assesses the victim's need for help and arranges services for them.

Help and assistance may be available even if the victim doesn't report crimes.

If a victim wishes to report a crime, the NAS will help and support in the process.

The safety of the victim is taken into account when services are arranged.

Processing of Personal Data

The information provided on this form is stored in the electronic case management system (UMA) used by the NAS. The system is used for the statutory tasks of the NAS, such as decision-making concerning client admittance.

If you are admitted as a client of the NAS, the system will be used to assess your service needs and organise services. The relevant documents are archived in the system. Your data will not be disclosed to other authorities without your consent, except in situations separately provided for by law.

Your information will never be disclosed to third parties.

Your data will not be disclosed to the authorities in your home country (*applies to foreign nationals*).
